Paul is one of the most significant philanthropic thinkers of our generation. He was President of one of the world's largest foundations, the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, for a decade and is the co-author of "Money Well Spent: A Strategic Plan for Smart Philanthropy" as well as numerous scholarly articles.
